To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Rapid City, South Dakota, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, including the Act of June 11, 1906, (34 Stat., 233), the claim of Charles Anderson, has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the H. R. Survey No. 287, embracing a portion of Sections nine, fifteen and sixteen in Township four north of Range one east of the Black Hills Meridian, South Dakota, more particularly bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at corner No. 1; from which the corner to Sections nine. ten, fifteen and sixteen in said Township four north, bears south eightynine degrees fifty-seven minutes east two and sixty-two-hundredths chains distant: Thence, south twenty degrees twenty-nine minutes east seven and forty-eight-hundredths chains to corner No. 2; Thence, south twenty degrees twenty-nine minutes east one and thirty-one-hundredths chains to corner No. 3; Thence, south five degrees twenty-four minutes east seventeen and sixteen-hundredths chains to corner No. 4; Thence, south seventeen degrees twenty-eight minutes west six and eighty-four-hundredths chains to corner No. 5; Thence, south seventeen degrees twenty-eight minutes west six and eighty-one-hundredths chains to corner No. 6; Thence, south twenty-nine degrees six minutes west seven and forty-six-hundredths chains to corner No. 7: Thence, south six degrees twenty minutes east nine and fifty-four-hundredths chains to corner No. 8; Thence, south fifty-two degrees fifty-eight minutes east three and seventy-four-hundredths chains to corner No. 9; Thence, south forty-five degrees twentyfour minutes west ten and eight-hundredths chains to corner No. 10; Thence, north seventy-four degrees four minutes west four and fourteen-

hundredths chains to corner No. 11: Thence, north thirty-four degrees forty minutes east five and one-hundredth chains to corner No. 12; Thence, north ten minutes east thirteen and forty-nine-hundredths chains to corner No. 13; Thence, north seventeen degrees fifty-five minutes east nineteen and eleven-hundredths chains to corner No. 14; Thence, north seventeen degrees nine minutes west twenty-two and thirty-fourhundredths chains to corner No. 15; Thence, north nine degrees twentynine minutes west five and fifty-one-hundredths chains to corner No. 16: Thence, north nine degrees twenty-nine minutes west fourteen and eightyseven-hundredths chains to corner No. 17; Thence, north sixty-seven degrees twenty-eight minutes east four and two-hundredths chains to corner No. 18; Thence, south seventeen degrees thirty-six minutes east ten and sixty-two-hundredths chains to corner No. 19; Thence, south fortynine degrees eight minutes east four and twenty-five-hundredths chains to corner No. 20; Thence, south twenty degrees twenty-nine minutes east three and fifty-two-hundredths chains to corner No. 1, the place of beginning, containing fifty-two and thirty-hundredths acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

NOW KNOW YE, That there is, therefore, granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Charles Anderson, the tract of land above described; TO HAVE

AND TO HOLD the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Charles Anderson, and to his heirs and assigns, forever; subject, however, to the provisions of section three of said Act of June 11, 1906, "That all entries under this Act in the Black Hills Forest Reserve shall be subject to the quartz or lode mining laws of the United States, and the laws and regulations permitting the location, appropriation, and use of the waters within the said forest reserves for mining, irrigation, and other purposes; and no titles acquired to agricultural lands in said Black Hills Forest Reserve under this act shall west in the patentee any riparian rights to any stream or streams of flowing water within said reserve." And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.
